Hello Ms. Girvin,

Please note the email stream below to/from you and your agency and myself.

The residents of northeast Scottsdale and surrounding areas are still waiting for the FAA to present responsible solutions to the major issues that have been submitted to your agency regarding the NextGen flight paths out of Phoenix Sky Harbor International Airport. As you know, the U.S. Court of Appeals ruled that the FAA implemented those Sky Harbor NextGen flight paths illegally and that your agency was "arbitrary and capricious".

It has been seven months since your agency conducted public workshops in the Phoenix area to collect comments and suggestions regarding these flight paths. Your agency displayed "concepts" for some minor changes addressing these issues. Yet not a word from your agency after all this time.

It is time for you to stop your foot dragging and present to Scottsdale area residents your serious solutions to these issues.

A simple accounting and sorting of comments from the workshops will not be acceptable. Only serious responses to the solutions presented to the FAA by the City of Scottsdale, SCANA and others will fulfill your responsibilities and satisfy the expectations of all of those concerned here. Our patience is wearing thin. Your failure to fully rescind the illegally implemented flight paths will only increase the communities resolve to force you to do so. The drumbeat to take more aggressive actions, including asking the Court to reaffirm it's ruling regarding the illegal implementation of NextGen at Sky Harbor, will only intensify.

If you do not respond to the needs of the community in the near future, expect more aggressive steps to commence. The FAA game of delay, deception and refusal to address our communities concerns must come to an end.
